Conduct and Customs

Everyone is requested to display the proper customs of etiquette, decorum and behavior, and to obey all Tournament policies, signs and verbal instructions of Tournament officials. For the safety of everyone, and in keeping with policy established at major sporting events, running is considered to be unacceptable behavior. In fairness to patron access and viewing, only one stool/seat will be allowed per person entering the grounds. Seats in observation stands are not to be reserved and stools/seats are not to be unattended for any inordinate length of time. Although cheering and positive patron responses to great play are encouraged, unsolicited or consistent calls from the gallery are prohibited.

For player safety and protection, there is a NO AUTOGRAPH POLICY enforced on the golf course for the Practice and Tournament days. Autograph seeking is allowed only in areas adjacent to the Practice Range and on the Par 3 course during the Par 3 Contest.


